While it is common knowledge that RHA is based on a concept quite successful in the west, little is known about the program that inspired the founders- **Re-Food**. Launched in Lisbon, Portugal in 2011 by American-Hunter Halder, this program aims at

ending hunger and food wastage, addressing two critical concerns of mankind simultaneously. It has approximately 750 volunteers

750 volunteers across Lisbon who collect food from more than 300 outlets; repackage and distribute it daily to around 1000 hungry people,

Learning from this endeavor, RHA was started in India in September 2014 in order to address the paucity of food and poverty crisis faced by the sub-continent in general. food is wasted and not a single person goes to bed on an empty stomach.

The Robin Hood Army launched a unique mass initiative on India's and Pakistan's Independence Days, 2015-**#Mission100k.** The initiative aimed at uniting students and young professionals across the India & Pakistan to rally together and serve food to 100,000 homeless people on Independence Day. This initiative was executed in partnership with Uber, ScoopWhoop and Zomato.

#Mission100K received an overwhelming response. Over 2400 citizens2400 citizens (Robins & Non- Robins), 141 colleges and offices across 23 cities participated in the initiative and contributed to its huge success. The participants visited 42 orphanages and managed to serve 92,000 people across the various cities. The satisfied smiles on the faces of the homeless and hungry served as reward and encouragement for our volunteers.
